










- Children first speak / listen before they can read or write.
- Basic oral and aural skills development is a good starting point for teaching English as a foreign language.

Aural-Oral Skills

Research shows that young learners need to develop solid

aural/oral skills before they begin formal reading instruction.

Aural language - refers to listening.

Oral language - refers to speaking.

Oral /Aural Stage

- Meaningful Interaction: Expose pupils to the language through natural discourse for authentic purposes.
- Familiarize pupils with the sound system of the language.
- Develop a broad lexical and linguistic base
- Provide multiple means of language input and use (stories, songs, drama, dialogues etc.)

- Providing opportunities for oral interaction in the foreign language to understand and convey meaning.

- While aural-oral skills are developing, read to the pupils in a variety of genres.

Very First Lesson/s

- Introduce yourself in L1/L2
- Equipment for the English class
- Warm up (good morning, what's your name?)
- Why is it important to learn English?
- Name Cards
- Cognates

COGNATES

Show the pupils how much English they know!

Most Foundation Level Stage 1 books begin with a page with cognates, or a song with cognates.

Show Flashcards with cognates. "I can see a phone"

Cognates are also used to teach sound-letter correspondence.

Aural-Oral Lesson Components

- 1. Warm up (greetings, chants, songs, dialogues, etc)
- 2. Review and presentation of new material
- 3. Practice Orally (frontal, pair work)
 - Practice Written Work (without words!!)
 - picture dictation
 - draw/color/circle

4. Closure

How to Begin "Warm-Up" part of the lesson:

1.Teach patterns :

Good MorningHow are you?/How old are you?My name is....Today is.....I live in.....The weatherDays of WeekMonths of YearI'm a boy/girlI'm a boy/girl

Use: Puppets Posters Songs Chants Pictures. Every few lessons – review and present new.

2. Simple Instructions

Stand up/ sit down Listen / Read/ Write Open/close / the window/the door

Show me/Point to/ Come here/ What no . ? Color – Draw - Circle

Task: In pairs – decide how you would teach Some of the above. Present.

Remember- lots of repetition and choral Speaking!

3. Dialogues

- 1. Show a picture.
- 1. Ask the pupils in L1 what they think is happening.
- 1. Present the dialogue:
 - Pupils repeat after you
 - Split the class in ½ each half plays a role
 - Pupils practice in pairs
 - pupils can present

4. Chants

How are you today, kids (x2) Great, great How are you today, kids (x2) Good, good How are you today, kids (x2) So so, (x2) How are you today, kids (x2) Not so good (x2)

To teach each topic, the teacher must prepare a bank of pictures, chants, songs, stories and activities WITHOUST, INTRODUCING THE WRITTEN WORD!!




Suggestions to help students ease back into learning English...

Take it slowly...

Reintroduce Yourself

Re-establish Rapport

Review and Repeat





Suggestions to help students ease back into learning English

Go Back to Basics - Teach Cognates, Review ABCs, Numbers, Days of the Week, Colors, About You, My Friends, Animals, My Feelings, My Family...

Reestablish Routines - Same openings and closings each session (Hello and Goodbye songs...)

Make it Fun - singing songs, using puzzles, playing game in person, coloring, matching...

Why are songs so popular in language learning? Songs are a wonderful way to:

- provide listening comprehension practice
- reinforce learned language patterns
- introduce and practice speaking new vocabulary
- give pupils feeling of achievement
- add a harmonious atmosphere in a classroom

Teach Cognates @ any level

There are many English-Hebrew cognates that students already know:

Teach Cognates




